Yara has won several acting awards and been nominated for 27. She signed with Women Management modeling agency in NYC in 2016 to give women of color a bigger voice in the fashion industry. The important breakout role in her career was her supporting role in "Black-ish" and her subsequent starring role in the spinoff, "Grown-ish."



This breakout role won her the NAACP Image Award for Outstanding Supporting Actress in a Comedy Series. Yara has also founded a production company called 7th Sun with her mother, which is now signed with ABC Studios to produce TV shows.

Yara is incredibly accomplished outside of her acting career; she founded Eighteen x 18 to encourage people
